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Potato Planting & Harvest

You'll need 3-4 lbs of potatoes to plant a 50' row.

1. Plant seed potatoes whole or cut them in pieces with 2-3 eyes (new growth sprouts).
2. Cure the cut pieces by spreading them out in a bright, airy place for 24 hours, or until they are slightly dry.
3. Plant potatoes in rows spaced 3 ft. apart. Place 2 pieces 6" apart (for a hill), and cover them with a 4-5' of soil. As the vines grow, hill soil, leaves, or compost over them to keep the developing tubers covered.

Best cultivars: '**Norland**'– early, medium sized, oblong, scab-resistant, red tubers with compact tops. '**Kennebec**'– late maturing, white, blocky tubers, scab– and blight-resistant, great storage. '**Yukon Gold**'– best winter storage, use raw or cooked; '**Walla Walla**'– the original sweet onion, best raw for immediate use
